3 Quick Tips to Refresh your knowledge

1. Pick up your Art of Hosting Journal again and dip into the sections that talk about organisational paradigms, the Chaordic Stepping Stones and the 5 breaths. These concepts help to explain the wider field we're working with and some of the cutting edge ideas about what's needed when we work in groups. Give yourself a reminder about why you want to work differently and how that might happen.



- Take your learning further on each of the methodologies. Google the Open Space
 Technology website, the World Café website, the Appreciative Inquiry Commons, and
 maybe join their listserves. Christina Baldwin has a great guide to PeerSpirit circles on her
 website, as well.
- 3. **Get practicing!** Come to the Community of Practice meetings, grab colleagues who also attended the workshop, connect with fellow participants and ask them to buddy you. The best way to get practice is to start practicing. What is your commitment to making the most of the training? *Get started now!*

What's new about this year's events?

The Facilitator Team

We have a talented, multi-disciplinary team holding and facilitating our events this year. **Toke** joins us again. **Monica** is an international expert on harvesting, **Tim** is leading large processes for young people and on strategic change. **Bob** is an Aikido Master and has run his own dojo. This team has vast experience overseas and will arrive with plenty of practical stories about how Art of Hosting has been applied and how it works in different contexts. Ou NZ team consists of: **Mary-Alice** is a leading narrative practitioner, who has taken culture change to scale. **Helen** has worked with senior and leadership teams throughout the public & private sector. **Craig** has been in senior leadership in the public sector with over 30 years experience. We will also have selected apprentices working with the facilitator team during the training events.

The Support Teams

We took a close look at what happened at the event last year and decided to include a number of teams to support participants to have the most positive, powerful experience yet. This year we're adding three support teams to each of our training events made up of past participants.

A **coaching team** will help individual and group participants to become very clear about where they can apply AoH skills within their practice and their organisation. This team will be focusing on the "nitty gritty" -- where can you use this, when can you use this, why should you use it and what do you need to get started. Craig will be stewarding this team.

Harvesting teams at each event will help the group to make the most of the experience during and after the training. The harvesting team will come prepared to capture what we're learning in many forms and will be open to participants to join during the event. If you've always wondered how to get others to understand what happened during your meetings and step with you into the future, this is the place to be! Monica will be stewarding this team.

Each of our events will also have a **Logistics team** to make sure the group is well-supported on every level. Helen will be stewarding this team.

Notes from Copenhagen...

Last August, Toke put out an invitation for a Learning Village in Copenhagen during the CoP15. I joined 15 others from around the world for 10 intense days of deep inquiry, outreach, facilitation and learning. We met in a flat near the train station at least twice daily, took part in a wide variety of activities, hosted a public Open Space and I spent 5 days inside the KlimaForum as a volunteer on the Climate Solutions Meshwork. I could dramatically see the difference between "broadcast" and the power of transformational conversation and I felt hopeful at all the connections being made and the future of this work. A rich experience!
